## **APPENDIX D – REPORT ON FUNDING**

## 3- Summary of Project Outcomes:

The main goal of this fund was to structure our Federation and to develop the teaching of chess nationwide. To do so, we had to make sure we had the proper knowledge and the proper certifications.

Our first step was to get at least 1 arbiter and 1 trainer certified by FIDE which we did. We wanted to develop and harmonize a teaching model for all coaches to follow. We also wanted to make sure that our tournaments meet FIDE specifications. This is why we followed a arbiter seminar with the Quebec Chess Federation and sent two members to the AIDEF seminar in Paris to take the exams which they both passed.

We also have international coaches and trainers to come to help us conceive an efficient approach to teaching chess.

Second step, was to acquire proper equipment to develop chess in a larger scale. We imported 7 electronic boards to streamline our tournaments online and 1000 chess sets as part of our chess in school and chess in prison programs.

We also focuses in training our national teams for the Olympiads. We hired the service of a GM who is coaching online our male team and our local coaches are assisting online as well the female team. The funds have also allowed to prepare for the first time a female national team. For the first time since our Federation exists, Haiti will participate with a female delegation in Russia.

## 6. Lessons Learned/Future Improvements:

Since July 2019, Haiti has been going through a terrible political crisis which has lingered up to December.

Implementing the initial program has not been easy so we had to adapt continuously all along. The lessons I learned was to always have an alternative that one can fall back on in case there are unforeseen obstacles.

It is important for the committee to have regular meetings to evaluate the current status of the ongoing projects and the outcome. It is also important to conceive projects with objectives that are achievable and constructive by each grant. It is not recommended to reach a phase after the funds have been spent, that cannot be capitalized unless another grant is released.

Have a strong committee with enough character to face criticisms when investing in long term projects and not just on one time tournaments to please the players.

During the last quarter of the year 2019, we have emphasized on the training sessions for both our national teams in light of the Olympiads in 2020 in Russia.

We have hired the assistance of a Russian GM to coach online our male team through Zoom. Every Saturday at 16:00, we have a 2 hour session for our top 12 players with GM Andreï Schekachev.

Likewise, we have been training our female national team with two of our national coaches among whom Jacques Muller Luxama who has just been awarded in September 2019 the title of FIDE Trainer after attending the seminar in Paris organized by AIDEF. The Haitian Chess Federation will be attending the next Olympiad for the very first time with a femal team. The online training will continue until July 6. From that moment on, we will have GM Thal Abergel come to Haiti for a 2 week training with our male team.

One of the main element that needed to be improved was our assets. Our Federation had only 24 chess sets dedicated to tournaments. Our main focus was to equipped our Federation with proper equipment so we could launch the massification and promotion of chess nationwide and also, host bigger tournaments.

We first purchased 7 electronic chess boards to streamline our tournaments online. That also served as teaching tools to showcase to younger players the beauty of the game and encourage them to analyze the games and bring their own solutions.

We also purchased 1000 chess sets directly from China to benefit from a discounted price. We were able to have the order shipped to Port-au-Prince free of charge thanks to an importer who offered to include this order in his container.

The chess sets have been used in our program "Chess in Education" and made available to the affiliated clubs. We were able to supply the schools with very affordable chess sets which is usually the heaviest financial burden when schools invest in our program.

About 300 units will be left aside for our project in the penitentiaries "Chess and Liberty" which will be financed this year if FIDE grants us another allocation.

We have organized the national tournament to select the top 5 players female and male to attend the Olympiads.

We have also attended the Central America and Caribbean Tournament in Trinidad-and-Tobago with one of our up and coming young players. It is important for players to understand the opportunities which lies ahead when one becomes a good chess players and being able to travel is a major booster on young players to encourage them to train and improve themselves.

Much of our goals have not been reached due to the sever political turmoils and civil unrests that have affected the social and business environment. For three months (September, October and November) schools have been shot down. This situation has made impossible the launching of the CIS. Furthermore, starting from January, schools have been catching up with the classes which leaves no time at all to introduce chess programs.

#### CONCLUSION

Our plan to develop chess in the country has been greatly affected by the political situation which has paralyzed the social and economic lives for about 3 months. Schools have remained closed for about 3 months dues to civil unrests. We had to change strategies on several occasions in order to continue to perform as per the expectations of our members. Many areas have been totally sealed throughout the year by gang fights, burning tires and political unrests. However, we have still managed to reach and exceed many of our goals.

For this coming year, we expect to introduce chess in the prison, in the orphanage and continue to develop chess in school.
