Jamaica's two (2) representatives were each provided with US\$600.00 to defray the cost of airfare to the tournaments.

The funding from FIDE was used to provide full airfare, accommodation and stipend for a coach to accompany the team. Full airfare costs for two of Jamaica's representatives, were covered with the funding from FIDE.

5. Due to the late submission of our request for funding from FIDE, the Jamaica Chess Federation was only entitled to receive 50% of the funding requested. As such, we were not able to proceed with our National Junior Chess Training Programme.

An amount of approximately **U\$1100** has been spent on venue costs, prizes and arbiter fees related to juniors for each of the events.

- 4. Jamaica's Junior Players participated in five tournaments outside of Jamaica during the period, with assistance from the funding provided by FIDE. The total amount expended by the JCF on these trips was approximately US\$11,500.00. It is almost impossible to disaggregate to determine the exact amount that came from FIDE. Subtracting the previous amounts from the FIDE subvention indicates that approximately U\$5500.00 was provided by FIDE for these trips.

6. Lessons Learned/Future Improvements:

- 1. Prior coaching is just as important as sending a coach with team overseas, therefore the junior chess training programme is critical. A permanent Jamaica Junior Chess Academy may necessary to take the juniors to the next level of development.
- 2. Need to know what the baselines are through exact surveys and counting, as opposed to estimating.
- 3. There is greater value in hosting international events locally, so that more juniors can benefit.
- 4. Our female players are even more successful than our males, so we have to look at developing women's chess as a priority.
