Results for Proposal FAPR Year 2019 Budget: \$18,000 USD

Dear Mr. President

For 2019, we present a proposal to FIDE for a budget of 25,000 USD as candidate campaign promise. After receiving \$18,000 we report to FIDE the way we utilized the money provided. We appreciate the effort FIDE does to help small federations like ours. Since we received this sponsor late in 2019, we were forced to cut spending, and we were not able to use all of it. Still we have that money in our accounts for this Olympic year. We hope to continue enjoying this opportunity.

Local Open Tournaments

\$3,500 USD

The FAPR encouraged local clubs all around Puerto Rico to produce high quality tournaments. The FAPR identified seven tournaments, and sponsored them with \$500 USD each. In exchange, the chess players in Puerto Rico did have good tournaments in compliance with FIDE and FAPR standards, and well spread throughout the island.

Puerto Rico National Championship – Classic Control Time

\$2,500 USD

Price money for the National Championship was \$2,000 and for arbiters \$500.

Puerto Rico National Championship – Blitz

\$550 USD

Youth Development – Championship (by age) – Pan-American Delegation
\$3,000 USD

As well as a very good preparation in Puerto Rico, prior to the competition. Including the total cost of the Puerto Rico Championship (by age): arbiters, trophies and medals.

Administrative fees

Chess Materials
\$2,000 USD

GM Jose “Pepe” Cuenca visit
\$2,500 USD

In February 2020 Spanish GM Jose “Pepe” Cuenca will visit Puerto Rico to promote chess in our community. In addition his visit will expose Puerto Rico internationally through his online platforms. We have an International event between March 19-23 of 2020.

Award and Recognition
\$500 USD



Toward Olympiads 2020 Moscu
\$7,000 USD

Chess in Puerto Rico is not a professional career. Players, coaches, directors, and other will most of the time (if not all the time) will provide the time and effort free of charge. This tuff reality sometimes keep our best talent out of the equation. For the upcoming Olympiads Games in Moscu, the FAPR will provide \$500 to each representative (10 players, 2 coach, 1 delegate, and 1 head of delegation) for their own expenditures related to the travel, and the time off they sacrifice of their own respective jobs in Puerto Rico. **The remaining of the budget not used will be safe for that purpose.**
