

BACKGROUND

Trinidad and Tobago was one of the 4 pilot countries (one per continent) to be granted US\$20 000 from the FIDE development fund. The funding was provided based on the completion of an application package which included an operational, plan, KPIs and a signed agreement which were submitted in November 2018 and subsequently approved. The summary of activities for the year are highlighted below.



The National Youth chess Championships 2019 attracted 102 participants and was held at the University of Trinidad and Tobago - Couva Campus, from January 3-6, 2019. Of this number, 22 players were female. The event was quite successful without any incidents. The National Junior Championships took place over the period January 19, 20, 26, 27 2019 and attracted 30 players.

The National Prize-giving was held on **February 17, 2019** and the TTCA was happy to have Mr. Patrice Charles, Director of Physical Education and sport as its Feature Speaker. Mr. Charles expressed his delight with the fact that there were new policies, and procedures in place at FIDE which will positively affect the running of the TTCA. He said that these new policies are well aligned to the Ministry of Sport and Youth affairs new vision for the management of National Sporting Bodies within Trinidad and Tobago. He also reaffirmed the good relationship between the TTCA and the Ministry and pledged continued support.



INTERNATIONAL CHESS DAY







Trinidad and Tobago earned 3 medals in this event:


- Under 8 Absolute: Kyan Muradali-Silver Medal (CM title provisional on rating)

There was a return of the National Senior Chess Championships after its last edition in 2014.



Bronze Medal: FM Joshua Johnson (3rd IM norm)





LESSONS LEARNT AND AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

There are however a few areas for which increased focus should be placed are:

- Financial and overall sustainability: Though efforts are being made to change the existing operating model, the progress has been slow. More effort to be placed in engaging the community on the need an urgency to ensure the institution can survive through internal efforts and resources.
- Capacity building is key at all levels: players, technical officers, volunteers in areas of planning, reporting as well as increasing the playing levels of top players as we have seen there is significant talent even with limited local resources.
- Succession planning: Two young persons are on the current Executive, however this number should be increased so that we can build lasting capacity with the TTCA.
- Even greater efforts to be placed in seeking sponsors for various events which are aligned to the TTCA'S objectives and areas of focus.

- Increased focus on female players. The ratio of male players to youth female players is 3-1 and this could be increased with additional efforts geared towards female schools.
- A great deal of effort has been placed in using social and mainstream media in the profiling of the
 events. However, the TTCA needs to obtain a resource that is dedicated to such an important
 function, which will allow for even better profiling so that its work can be appropriately highlighted.

CONCLUDING REMARKS

2019 was an exceptional year for the TTCA. We are happy to report that there continues to be increased levels of interest in the sport of chess locally, with many schools opting to take up the sport as an extra curricula activity. There were also an increase in the number of youth tournaments held which will continue into 2020 and beyond. The TTCA is happy with the progress of its plan to date and has attained many of the objectives set out for 2019.

The TTCA also extends gratitude to FIDE for its unwavering support and looks forward to ongoing collaboration in developing chess in Trinidad and Tobago.
