For the moment we have held **4 Preparation of Lecturers (PoL)** online courses, one of which was pilot:

- 1. 2021/02/12-14 Pilot POL 10 participants, from which 6 CEL diploma holders.
- 2. 2021/03/12-14 1st POL 21 participants, from which 14 CEL diploma holders.
- 3. 2021/06/18-20 2nd POL 20 participants, from which 18 CEL diploma holders.
- 4. 2021/12/17-19 3rd POL 20 participants, diploma holders info will be provided.

And **5 Preparation of Teachers (PoT)** courses, one of which was pilot, one in French and one face-to-face in Kenya:

- 1. 2021/04/16-18 Pilot POT 27 participants, from which 21 SI title holders.
- 2. 2021/05/21-23 1st POT 29 participants, from which 26 SI title holders.
- 3. 2021/07/02-04 2nd POT 17 participants, from which 14 SI title holders.
- 4. 2021/12/10-12 POT in French 16 participants, from which 15 SI title holders.
- 5. 2021/12/15-18 PoT offline in Kenya 66 participants, titles holders info will be provided.

In total - 38 CEL's and 76 New School Instructors (SI)

The course was held 12-14 February online by Zoom.

- 13 people signed up
- 12 people attended the course one dropped out after contracting Covid19
- 2 Lecturers from CSRI (Chess Scientific Research Institute, which was responsible for creation of the course) and one from EDU ran the course.
- 10 attendees took the exam, thus completing the requisite combination of active participation, project & exam for a full evaluation.
- Special dispensation was allowed for attendees to submit their projects. In principle, submission should have been done on February 15. Several attendees did not submit until much later.
- Evaluation by the Lecturers required one week.
- Results of the evaluation were sent to the attendees on 28 February.
- 6 passed the course, 4 'failed'.
- Failure is relative; the 4 do not qualify for CEL but nevertheless learned a lot.

Details of the completed project/programme:

- Much feedback was received
- The feedback was extremely positive about most of the content
- There were two consistent complaints: (1) not enough about what EDU does and what 'educational chess' means; (2) not enough advance information about timings and what

the exam involved, but especially the placement of delivery of the project after the third day.

• All the major complaints were corrected (largely) in time for the first 'real' CEL course (12-14 March).

Breakdown on the use of funds (€1000):

- $3x \in 250 = 50$ to the 3 Lecturers.
- €250 as determined by EDU Chairman

Lessons Learned:

- implemented for the course 12-14 March
- That first course attracted 34 applications (too many!).
- It was limited to 20 first come, first served
- An administrative hiccup meant that we had 21 who each paid €75
- 14 of the 21 passed and the feedback has been consistently high (better more consistent -than in the Pilot).
