Commission

- Most of the NF who requested fund are from level 3-5, which are part of the target group. However
 25 Federations did not request funding from this group. It may be as a result of the NF's adminsitrative structure or other internal challenges.
- 2. Opportunities for the Continents: hybrid tournaments, social activities, rating and title events.
- 3. Besides tournaments, the other main activity is capacity building for arbiters, trainers and organizers: Possible events in coordination with Zones.
- 4. During 2020 the Continent usage of fund was more diversified. COVID-19 effect.
- 5. The Fed Forum initiative continues to provide important information to FIDE to help inform its offerings. Participating federations always express their content by this level of engagement. Besides that, the attendance in PDC Fed Forum decreased in comparison with 2020. This seems to be linked to the contact information not being accurate/up to date which makes it difficult to facilitate more direct communication channels like whatsapp or similar, not only email.

Background of the event

CHESS

Chess known as the "the touchstone of intellect", is regarded as the crown of intellectual sports in many developed countries. And the World Champions are treated as national heroes and the pride of the country and receive accolades from the head of state in person. Because of this, chess has a strong function of international communication.



FIDE

The International Chess Federation (FIDE) is the governing body of the sport of chess, and it was recognized by the International Olympic Committee as a Global Sporting Organization in 1999. FIDE was initially founded in 1924 in Paris under the motto "Gens una Sumus" (Latin for "We are one Family"). It was one of the very first International Sports Federations. It is now one of the largest, encompassing 199 countries and regions as affiliate members. Chess is nowadays a truly global sport, with dozens of millions of players in all the continents, and more than 60 million games on average played every day.





Zhu, Chen Women's World Champion Chess has deep roots in the Olympic Games, and as early as the 1924 Paris Olympic Games, chess was an exhibition sport. The Games featured 54 players from various countries competing in individual and team chess competitions. In 1999, the IOC officially recognized chess as a sport. Subsequently, at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games, chess was successfully performed as an exhibition sport.FIDE has made detailed plans for chess to enter the Olympic Games, accumulating experience step by step from entering large-scale intercontinental multi-sport games such as the Mind Games, Indoor Games, Asian Games, African Games, and the Americas Games, and on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the founding of FIDE in 2024, the historical origin of chess can be combined with Olympic culture and participate in the celebration activities related to the 2024 Paris Olympic Games.







CCA

Founded in 1986, the Chinese Chess Association (CCA) promotes the development of chess in China, and is also a member to FIDE.



China Phenomenon

China contributes 6 world chess queens. They are:

Xie Jun, Zhu Chen, Xu Yuhua, Hou Yifan, Tan Zhongyi and Ju Wenjun.

Xie Jun defeated the Maya Chiburdanidze in 1991 to win the women's world championship. After that, there were many newcomers in the field from China and Zhu Chen and Xu Yuhua won the title respectively. At the age of 16, Hou Yifan became the youngest world champion. In 2017, Tan Zhongyi won the championship. In 2018, Ju Wenjun became the sixth World Chess Queen from China.

Xie Jun defeated the Maya Chiburdanidze in 1991 to win the women's world championship. After that, there were many newcomers in the field from China and Zhu Chen and Xu Yuhua won the title respectively. At the age of 16, Hou Yifan became the youngest world champion. In 2017, Tan Zhongyi won the championship. In 2018, Ju Wenjun became the sixth World Chess Queen from China.

Although the intellectual game of chess has been thought of as a 'classic" for over 1500 years, it is rarely ever played outside of high stakes chess tournaments or recreational chess clubs. Over the course of 2020 however, the game became a daily practice for many individuals as the Covid-19 pandemic introduced more free time into many people's lives and a new TV series provided inspiration.

The hit Netflix show "The Queen's Gambit," helped bring the game of chess into the public eye, sparking an interest in the game's risky tactics and friendly competition. The limited series came out in late Oct. 2020, and quickly rose to fame as Netflix's No. 1 show, staying in Netflix's "top ten streaming titles" for 22 straight days. The show's intriguing storyline drew in a total of 62 million household viewers.

Since the show's release, chess-related sales have skyrocketed, showing the immense influence that a TV show can have on a population. According to The NPD Group, an American market research organization, unit sales of chess sets increased by 87% in the US, and chess book sales rose an astonishing 603% in the three weeks following the show's debut.

B) Launch a female high-level event (international or national)

- 1. Time: September to December 2022
- 2. Venue: Selected by the sponsor

① Online: International competition with 8-10 top chess players. The players are mainly World Chess Champions or Olympiad champions. Domestic chess players can gather at the location selected by the sponsor, and foreign players can participate online.
 ② Over the board: Domestic competition with 6-8 top chess players. The players are mainly World Chess Champions or Olympiad

champions.



C) 2022 China Women's Open Chess Tournament

1. Time: May to December 2022

2. Venue: Selected by the sponsor

3. Form: 5 groups through online audition, national preliminary competition and other layers of

selection, and the final stage is over the board.

D) Online seminars

1. Time: March-June 2022

2. Platform: Online

3. Form: Through various forms of online open classes, free for female enthusiasts with competition rules and tournament cases.

E) Glory history of China Women's Chess

1. Time: May to December 2022

2. Venue: Selected by the sponsor

3. Form: a historical review of Chinese women's chess, photo exhibitions and feature videos

F) Cultural and creative souvenirs

1. Time: July 2022

2. Form: To create a unique cultural and creative souvenirs.
