APPENDIX C

Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)

Last update: March 10th 2023

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS (KPIs)¹ are the critical (key) indicators of progress toward an intended result.

Beneficiaries² of the FIDE Development Fund are required to measure the effectiveness of their programmes using the KPIs that are relevant to each project. The table below lists KPIs globally relevant³ to a chess organization. Most of the KPIs shall be collected at the National Chess Federation level and consolidated at a higher grouping level (Zone, Continent, Affiliated organization, FIDE Commission). It is expected to follow the evolution of KPIs on a yearly basis. The history of KPIs shall be made available on the PDC website for Beneficiaries and FIDE stakeholders to consult them.

Baseline

At the end of each year, all KPIs shall be measured to constitute the new **Baseline**, the reference for the evaluation of the next year. It is possible that a Beneficiary may not be able to report on a particular KPI and this will be taken into consideration when updating the baseline.

FIDE Calculated KPIs: Some KPIs are based on data available in the FIDE database (e.g. Number of active players, arbiters, tournaments, seminars, etc.). These will be published directly by FIDE, without a need by the Beneficiary to provide them.

Declarative KPIs: Other KPIs (e.g. Number of chess clubs in the federation) shall be collected through the annual questionnaire⁴ sent by the FIDE Office to the National Chess Federations or through a request by PDC.

<u>Target</u>

When applying⁵ for funding, Beneficiaries shall select up to 4 KPIs impacted by the project to be funded and determine their **End of Period-target** values. They will show the expected results of the project, before it is executed.

<u>Actual</u>

When the Beneficiary is preparing its final report for the end of the reporting period, the **Actual** values of the KPIs need to be completed for each KPI identified and documented in Appendix D.

KPI STRUCTURE

The KPIs shall be divided into 4 main categories as follows:

Core: These KPIs are related to the technical operations of the federation. It includes number of active players, number of tournaments, average player ratings as well as supporting 'infrastructure' e.g. number of arbiters, trainers, etc.. These KPIs allow FIDE to ascertain the quality/quantity of the players, technical officials, events, etc...

APPENDIX C

Social/Special: These examine the engagement in additional programmes related to the work of other FIDE Commissions and their priorities. These include: females, kids/chess in education, vulnerable groups (refugees, people with special needs, chess in prisons etc.). Federations are encouraged to engage in at least one such programme. These KPIs allow federations to fulfil the horizontal goals of FIDE as chess impacts several aspects of society.

Promotion: This includes the focus on the dissemination and profiling of chess activities of the federation and FIDE support. This should include mainstream and social media. It is important that chess activities are highlighted so persons within the wider communities understand the value of chess and the role of FIDE which can increase the opportunities for support.

Partnerships: This includes sponsors, strategic partners whose objectives are aligned to the federation. Strategic partners can include other government agencies, NGOs, media outlets. These KPIs track the efforts of federations to engage other partners in the support of their mandate to build increased sustainability.
