AFRICAN CHESS CONFEDERATION END OF 2021 PERIOD REPORT

A: TOURNAMENTS

i. 2021 AFRICAN ONLINE INDIVIDUAL CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2021 African Online Individual Chess Championships were held in the Tornelo Chess Platform from January 25th to January 29th, 2021.

The event comprised the following categories:

- i. Main Open Section
- ii. Main Women's Section
- iii. Combined Seniors (Over 50) Section
- iv. Junior Open (Under 20) Section
- v. Junior Girls (Under 20) Section

A total number of 156 players from 27 African Federations took part in the event in which all the categories were played under a Rapid Time Control of 25 min plus 10 seconds per move from the first move.

ii. 2021 ARAB AFRICAN ONLINE INDIVIDUAL CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Following an agreement between the African Chess Confederation and the Arab Chess Federation, the 2021 Arab African Online Individual Championships were hosted from February 25 to 27, 2021 on the Lichess.com Platform.



The event was conducted under the Blitz Time Control of 3 minutes plus 2 Seconds per move from the first move.

In addition to the main prizes, there were also prizes for rating groups ranging from "Best Player Under 1200" to "Best Player Under 2000".

A total of 2, 116 participants took part in the event, which was a real success.

iii. AFRICAN FIDE WORLD CUP 2021 QUALIFICATION PROCESS

Upon the restructuring of the Regulations for the FIDE World Cup resulting in an increase in the number of participants from 128 to 206, the African Continent was allocated a total of 15 places for the FIDE World Cup 2021.

In line with the updated FIDE World Cup Regulations, ELEVEN African Federations were selected according to the average rating of their ten highest-rated players in the December 2020 FIDE Rating List.

These African Federations selected to nominate one player each to participate in the FIDE World Cup 2021 are Egypt, Algeria, Morocco, Zambia, South Africa, Tunisia, Nigeria, Angola, Uganda, Libya, and Zimbabwe.

This process then leaves FOUR places to be selected on a Continental level.

To ensure a wider participation in the final selection process of the FOUR places at the 2021 African Individual Chess Championships, the Board of the African Chess Confederation devised a pre-qualification process to be held online and termed as the 2021 African Online World Cup Pre-Qualifying Chess Championships.

The Zonal representatives selected through the 2021 African Online World Cup Pre-Qualifying Chess Championships will be sponsored to the final selection event, the 2021 African Individual Chess Championships to be hosted in Lilongwe, Malawi from May 17 to 28, 2021.

iv. 2021 AFRICAN ONLINE WORLD CUP PRE-QUALIFYING CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2021 African Online World Cup Pre-Qualifying Chess Championships were hosted on the Tornelo Chess Platform from 23rd April to 2nd May 2021.

The event comprised the following categories:

- i. Zone 4.1 Open and Women's Section
- ii. Zone 4.2 Open and Women's Section
- iii. Zone 4.3 Open and Women's Section
- iv. Zone 4.4 Open and Women's Section
- v. Zone 4.5 Open and Women's Section

In addition to the Prize Money for the top five players in the Open Section in each category and the top four players in the Women's Section of each category, the Winners in each category received economy class air travel sponsorship to the 2021 African Individual Chess Championships, which were held in Lilongwe, Malawi from May 17, 2021 (arrival) to May 28, 2021 (departure).

The Winners in each category were also be entitled to free board and lodging at the official accommodation venue for the duration of 2021 African Individual Chess Championships.

A total number of 123 players from took part in the event, with 75 in the Open Section and 48 in the Women's Section.

Zone 4.3 only had one player entered in the Open Section, with no entries in the Women's Section.

The player that was entered in the Open Section was added to the Zone 4.5 Open Section participants to enable him play in the event.

v. 2021 AFRICAN INDIVIDUAL CHESS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2021 African Individual Chess Championships were hosted in Lilongwe, the Capital City of Malawi from May 17 to 28, 2021.

The event comprised an Open Section and a Women's Section.

A total of 92 players from 17 African Federations took part in the 2021 African Individual Chess Championships.

58 players were entered in the Open Section, whilst 34 players played in the Women's Section.

GM Ahmed Adly of Egypt retained his title as African Champions after fierce competition from his compatriots.

He won the event on tiebreaks from GM Amin Bassem after they both tied 8 points after 9 Rounds.

ix. POSTPONEMENT OF OTHER OTB EVENTS

The African Chess Confederation had to postpone other Over-The-Board events due to the second and third waves of the Covid-19 pandemic in the prospective host Federations, where more stringent health protocols were put in place by the respective Governments.

The affected events were the following:

- a) The 2021 African Amateur Individual Chess Championships
- b) All the five 2021 Zonal Individual Chess Championships
- c) All the five 2021 Zonal Under 16 Youth Team Championships

B. OBSERVATIONS

- i. The global Covid-19 pandemic affected African Federations both as a unitary Continent as well as individually.
 - The previously planned capacity building projects were put on hold in many Federations as well as at Continental level.
- ii. No Zonal events were hosted, whilst the hosting of three youth Continental events coupled with the Continental Championship that was also a FIDE World Cup Qualifier signaled a potential return to full time over-the-board chess activities in 2022.

- iii. The declaration of 2022 as the Year for Women in Chess should provide a focus for building on the improving numbers of women participating chess activities. The African Continent needs to put in place intensified programmes for the encouragement of more women to participate chess activities, with appropriate incentives also being offered to Federations making the necessary to build on this initiative.
- iv. Continental Commission activities will need to be enhanced with appropriate funding mechanisms.

C: GOING FORWARD WITH ACC 2020 AND BEYOND

i. FOCUS ON PREPARATION OF TEACHERS SEMINARS

Following the overwhelming response and ultimate success of the FIDE Chess in Education Preparation of Teachers Seminar held on the sidelines of the 2021 African Schools Individual Chess Championships in the Kenya Capital of Nairobi, the African Chess Confederation intends to focus on hosting more such high-quality seminars to enhance the accelerated capacity building process on the African Continent.

ii. MEMBERSHIP OF THE AFRICAN UNION SPORTS COUNCIL

Following the alignment of the African FIDE Zones to the administrative regions of the African Union Sports Council to facilitate the African Chess Confederation application for full membership of the African Union Sports Council as approved by the 2019 First Quarter FIDE Presidential Board Meeting of March 15, 2019, the African Union Sports Council has confirmed the recognition of the African Chess Confederation.

Sports Development activities under the African Union Sports Council are conducted and funded through the administrative regions to which the African FIDE Zones are aligned.

Some of the African FIDE Zones had already started the Regional alignment process that will lead to chess being included amongst the Sport Codes in the Regional Games of the African Union Sports Council.

Ultimately, chess will also now qualify to automatically be included amongst the sport codes at the African Games starting with the 2023 African Games to be held in Ghana.

The African Zones will also now qualify for support from other African Union resources and funding opportunities through the Regional Development structures they are aligned to.

The Board of the African Chess Confederation will build on the foregoing and initiate other medium and long-term development programmes designed to keep African Federations focused on achieving the best in the available opportunities.
