2021 REPORT OF TOURNAMENTS

Asian Zone 3.6 Zonal Hybrid Chess Championship

Panoramic View of players

Asian Chess Federation and Oceania Chess Federation organized the Zone 3.6 Zonal Open Championship March 20-28. GMs Anton Smirnov and Temur Kuybokarov, both of Australia, ended up in a tie after the round robin among 8 players from 7 countries in Oceania..

More than 20 arbiters supervised 8 players on site and by zoom. It was the first online armageddon game in hybrid chess. Top two Australian Grandmasters competed and more than 90 percent were decisive games. Kuybokarov won the Armageddon.



Asian Zone 3.3 Open Hybrid Championship

Asian Chess Federation organized the Zone 3.3 Zonal Open Hybrid Championship May 1-10, 2021 with 52 players from six countries participating, namely Philippines, Malaysia, Indonesia, Singapore, Thailand and Laos. International Masters Daniel Quizon, 17, and Michael Concio Jr., 16, both of the Philippines, finished first and second, respectively.





Asian Zone 3.4 Zonal Open Chess Championship

From 6th May to 15th May 2021 in Tashkent took place Zonal 3.4 FIDE Championship 2021.

In the Championship took part 34 chess players from Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan.

The tournament was played over the board in 9 rounds. The last round and the Closing were on 15th May 2021. Winner of the Zonal Championship GM Abdusattorov Nodirbek (UZB) and the 2nd place GM Yakubboev Nodirbek both qualified to the FIDE World Cup 2021. Asian Zone 3.2 Zonal Hybrid Chess Championship



Asian Chess Federation and Bangladesh Chess Federation organized the Zone 3.2 zonal Hybrid Chess Championhip 1-9 June 2021 on Tornelo. A total of 39 players participated with 21 players from Bangladesh including Grandmaster Ziaur Rahman, Grandmaster Enamul Hossain Razib, International Master Mohammad Fahad Rahman, International Master Mohammad Minhazuddin, International Master Abu Sufian Shakil, two players from Maldives, three players from Nepal, ten players from Pakistan and three players from Sri Lanka, ree players from Nepal, ten players from Pakistan and three from Sri Lanka. Champion GM Ziaur Rahman received one thousand US dollars, runner-up GM Enamul Hossain Razib earned seven hundred us dollars, 3rd- CM Liyanage Ranindu Dilshan of Sri Lanka received five hundred us dollars, 4th- CM Manon Reja Neer of Bangladesh received three hundred us dollars, 5th- IM Mohammad Fahad Rahman of Bangladesh received two hundred us dollars, 6th-FM Khandaker Aminul Islam of Bangladesh, 7th-Mohammad Minhaz Uddin of Bangladesh and 8th A A C B Amarasinge of Sri Lanka received one hundred us dollars each. GM Ziaur Rahman qualified into the FIDE World Cup 2021.

Asian Continental Hybrid Chess Championship



Asian Individuals Hybrid Chess Championship 20 - 30 May 2021





Asian Chess Federation organized the Asian Continental Hybrid Chess Championship 20-30 May 2021 on Tornelo.

GM Shamsiddin Vokhidov, 19, of Uzbekistan and Singapore champion IM Tin Jingyao, 21, drew a fighting game with each other in the final round to tie with 7 points each and finish 1st and 2nd by tie break, respectively.

Participating was a strong field of 20 GMs, 20 IMs and 12 FMs.

The hybrid tournament had a total of 82 players from 15 countries, namely Australia, Bangladesh,

China, Indonesia, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Kuwait, Malaysia, Mongolia, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Chinese Taipei and Uzbekistan.

Five players finished in a tie with 6.5 points to qualify to the World Cup, namely GM Temur Kuybokarov of Australia, GM Amin Tabatabaei of Iran, GMs Nodirbek Yakubboev and Javokhir Sindarov of Uzbekistan and IM Mohamad Ervan of Indonesia. Also qualified by tie break are 6 pointers IM Sugar Gan-Erdene of Mongolia and GM Lu Shanglei of China since Kuybokarov and Yakubboev had already qualified from their Zonals.

Asian Zone 3.1 Zonal Hybrid Chess Championship

Iranian GMs Ehsan Ghaem Maghami and Aryan Gholami finished tied for first with 6 points out of 7 rounds in the Zone 3.1 Zonal Hybrid Chess Championship held 1-9 June 2021 on Tornelo. Ghaem Maghami qualified by tie break to the World Cup.



Asian Schools Chess Championship



Asian Chess Federation and National Chess Federation of the Philippines organized the Asian Schools Online Chess Championship 23-31 July 2021 with over eight hundred girls and boys from 25 countries participating. The Girls

Championship was held in the weekend of 23-25 July while the boys (open) championship was held 29-31 July 2021 on Tornelo.

The tournament was played with the following categories: Under-7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17. The Asian Schools Chess Championships 2021 are individual and team championships combined. Each national federation may be represented by individuals or by teams. India-A won the under-15 age category by a wide margin with 29 points for gold followed by Indonesia team-A with 23.5 for silver and Iran team B with 23 points for the bronze. Actually India-B garnered 24 points but shared the award of India Team-A.

In the Under-13 category, Uzbekistan team-A won gold with 27 points followed by Iran-A with 25.5 and India team-B with 25 points.

India team-A dominated the under-11 category with 26 points for gold followed by Iran team-A with 23.5 points for silver and Kyrgyzstan with 21.5 for bronze.

India team-B won the under-9 category with 26 points followed by Mongolia with 24.5 and Iran-A with 23.5.

A team consists of 4 players with a maximum of

7

two teams per age category in each Open Division and two teams per age category in each Girls Division.

Indian teams won the Under-7, 9, 11 and 15 age categories while Uzbekistan won the Under-13 age group and Iran won the Under-17 age group in the boys division of the Asian Schools Chess Championships over the 29-31 July weekend on Tornelo.

Iran team-A won the under-17 team championship with 26 points for the gold followed by India-B with 25 points for silver and Philippines-A with 23 points for bronze. India-A finished with 24 points but regulations state that a country can win only one team trophy per category.

India team-A won the under-7 category with 28 points for gold followed by Iran-A with 21.5 for silver and Philippines-A with 20 points for bronze. Here is Gold, Silver and Bronze Medal Tally of Girls and Boys events combined for all 12 events U-7, 9, 11, 13, 15 and 17.

Indian boys won the gold medals in the Under-7, 9 and 15 divisions while Iran won Under 11 and 13 divisions, and Mongolia won the Under-17 age group in the Asian Schools Chess Championships held over the weekend of 29-31 July on Tornelo.

In a portent of the future, six Indian boys finished in the top 6 places in the youngest Under-7 age group. Chauhan Avirat scored 8 points for the gold medal, conceding only one loss to compatriot Upadhyaya Advik who finished in a tie with Bathula Aarush and

Ramakrishnan Rahul at 7.5 points each. Aarush won silver and Advik the bronze by tie break. Sina Movahed of Iran also scored 8 points for gold in the Under-11 division followed by compatriot Armin Gholami with 7.5 points for silver. Four players tied with 7 points each. Krishna Goutham of India won the bronze by tie break over Steven Tan of Indonesia, Rajkhowa Mrinmov of India dn Rustam Hossein Mohammadi Akbarabadi of Iran scored 8 points to win gold in the Under-13 division followed by Singh Sahib of India for silver and Bakhrom Bakhrillaev of Uzbekistan for bronze in a tied with 7.5 points each. International Master M. Prahesh of India and teammate Shubh Kapur scored 8 points each in the Under-15 division. Pranesh won gold by tie break over Shubh. Compatriot FIDE Master S. Harshad scored 7.5 points for the bronze.

Candidate Master Nyamsuren of Mongolia won gold in the Under-17 division after winning the tie break in 3way tie at 7.5 points each. Alireza Bosagh Zadeh of Iran won silver and Kamotra Soham of India won the bronze.

Asian Nations Cup U-14 Chess Team Championship for Boys and Girls

Asian Chess Federation and Sri Lanka Chess Federation organized the Asian Nations Cup Under-14 Chess Team Championship 27-29 March 2021 online on chess.com. Indian A team won the Championship convincingly with a score of 15 Match points out of possible 18. India led the event from the beginning and finally earned the Gold Medal with the Championship Trophy and other awards in the Asian Nations Cup Under-14 Team Championship for boys and girls.

Iran Girls Team A won the Girls division, prevailing in a tie with Mongolian Girls Team I, at 15 points each but with a tie break score of 26 against Monglia's 24.5. Asian Chess Federation General Secretary Hisham Al Taher attended the online awards ceremonies together with Sri Lanka Chess Federation president Luxman Wijesuriya, Hong Kong Chess Federation president K.K. Chan, ACF Arbiters Commission



Chairman Mahdi Abdulrahim. The Silver medal for boys went to Iran Chess Team with 14 match points out of 18 possible. Though the 3rd place of both events were won by India B and Mongolia Girls Team II respectively, they were not entitled for the awards on the regulations stipulating one trophy per country. The Malaysia Avengers scored 12 match points to win the Bronze Medal. More than 50 teams from 20 Asian Countries participated in the event. Bahrain, Bangladesh, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Maldives, Malaysia, Mongolia, New Zealand, Oman, Pakistan, Palestine, Philippines, Thailand, UAE and Sri Lanka contested for the supremacy.



Asian Chess Federation organized the Asian Junior and Girls Chess Championships for Players with Disabilitie 13-15 August 2021. Armin Rahmat Pour of Iran and R.P. Kanishri of India won the Asian Juniors and Girls Chess Championships for Players with Disabilities, respectively on Tornelo. A total of 22 players from six countries competed in the boys division. Rahmat Pour, who is deaf, scored 4.5

points in the 5 round Swiss boys division. Loo, Abolfazi Kazemiyan Esko of Iran and Sultan Kozhakhmetov of Kazakhstan followed with 4 points each but after tie break the Malaysian got silver while Kazemihyan won the bronze.

R.P. Kanishri of India scored 5 points out of 6 games.The Girls Division was played as a Round Robin among 7 players.

Asian Women's Continental Online Chess Championship

Asian Chess Federation organized the Asian Women's Continental Online chess Championship 23-25 August 2021 on Tornelo. IM Bibisara Assaubayeva of Kazakhstan won the Asian Women's Continental Online Chess Championship and became the Asian continental nominee to the FIDE Chess.com Grand Swiss this October in Riga, Latvia.





Asian Chess Federation organized the Asian Women's Continental Online chess Championship 23-25 August 2021 on Tornelo. IM Bibisara Assaubayeva of Kazakhstan won the Asian Women's Continental Online Chess Championship and became the Asian continental nominee to the FIDE Chess.com Grand Swiss this October in Riga, Latvia.

Assaubayeva, 17, finished alone in first, undefeated with 7.5 points. WIM Ning Kaiyu of China won the silver medal with 7 points. Bronze medal went to WIM Turmunkh Munkhzul of Mongolia with the highest tie break among 5 players tied with 6.5 points each.

The Malaysian team of WFM Tn i Ting, WCM Sivanesan Nithyalakshmi, WIM Puteri Munajjah Az-Zahraa Azhar and WFM Puteri Rifqah Fahada Azhar score 21 points for bronze with a better tie score break over host Indonesia. WGM V. Varshini of India won the individual championship alone in first place with 7.5 points followed by Safoura Ghani of Iran in second place with 7 points and WFM Tannaz Ghani of Iran in third place with 6.5 points and the better tie break score. 
Asian University Chess Championship (Men)

Iran and Sri Lanka finished with 2 gold medals each but Iran grabbed overall runner-up with 3 silvers against Sri Lanka's one silver medal. IM Harshana Thilakarathne (above left) won the gold medal in the highest group, Under-18 while countrymate Oshini Devindya Gunawardena (above right) lived up to her billing by winning the gold in the Girls Udner-10. The western Asian Online Youth Chess Championships was organized by the Asian Chess Federation in cooperation with the Chess Federation of Sri Lanka from 18th – 20th September 2021. Close to 900 players participated in this biggest online Chess Event of Asia on Tornelo platform. The time control was 15 minutes + 10 seconds for each move played.

The Countries of Bangladesh, India, Iran, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Kuwait, Maldives, Nepal, Oman, Palestine, Syria, UAE, Uzbekistan and Sri Lanka participated in the event.

Vietnam dominated the Eastern Asia Youth Chess Championship Girls division winning 10 gold medals followed by China and Mongolia winning one gold medal apiece. Over 300 girls from 14 countries competed in the Eastern Asian Youth Chess Championship Girls division held over the weekend of 24-26 September on Tornelo.

Participating in the tournament are players from Australia, Brunei, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Mongolia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Chinese Taipei and Vietnam. Visit chess-results.com for round by round results and to download games.

The tournament was organized by the Thailand Chess Association under the auspices of the Asian Chess Federation. The champions qualified to the FIDE Online Cadets and Youth Rapid Grand Prix.

The Organizing Committee implemented FIDE Fair Play Rules strictly and a number of players found violating Fair Play regulations were forfeited for some or all of their games. Arbiters from Thailand, Vietnam, Mongolia, Malaysia, Hong Kong and Philippines monitored players.

China, Vietnam, Malaysia Top Eastern Asia Youth Boys Division



China won 3 gold medals followed by Vietnam with 2 golds and Malaysia with one gold to rule the Eastern Asia Youth Chess Championship last weekend from 1-3 October 2021 on Tornelo. Hussein finished alone with 7 points, undefeated in the 9-round Swiss system. Thirty four players competed in the Over-50 division from seven countries, namely Iraq, Kyrgyzstan, Pakistan, Palestine, Philippines, Syria and Yemen. The field included three International Masters, three FIDE Masters and one Candidate Master.

Takyrbashev of Kyrgyzstan and Moaaz Boshy of Syria finished with 7 points each but the Kyrgyz prevailed in the Direct Encounter tie break for the champion's trophy. FIDE Master Sursock Sameer of Lebanon finished in a 3-way tie for 3rd place with 6 ponts but prevailed in the Direct Encounter tie break. Fifteen players competed from six countries, namely Iran, Jordan, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Palestine and host Syria.

Rapid chess championship alone in first place with 5.5 points out of 7 rounds followed by Tilek Takyrbashev of Kyrgyzstan with 5 points for second place. Untitled VS Rahul (2387) of India finished alone unbeaten with 7 ½ points out of 9 games to emerge Asian Junior Chess Champion 2021 and earn the IM title and a GM norm while compatriot WIM Shri Savitha won the girls division alone with 7 points to earn a WGM norm.

After a poor start, the top seed, International Master Mitrabha Guha of India recovered well to place 2nd with 7 points while International Master GB Harshawardhana of India became 3rd with 6 ½ points.

India's K Priyanka and Iran's Anousha Mahdian tied for the 2nd place with 6 ½ points, but Priyanka won the Silver Medal with better tie break and Anousha had to satisfy herself with the Bronze Medal. Anousha gets a Woman International Master Norm as well.


Rahul also won the blitz championship held on the closing day with 6½ points out of 7 rounds.

Mohammadi Melika of Iran won the Girls blitz championship with 6 points out of 7 rounds with a better tie break over Savitha of India who finished also with 6 points.









99th Internet based FIDE Arbiters' Seminar




The 99th Internet Based FIDE Arbiters' Seminar was held from 7th to 11th April 2021.

FIDE International Organizers Seminar




Asian Chess Federation and National Chess Federation of the Philippines organized online IO seminar under the auspices of the FIDE Events Commission from 24-26 April 2021.



Under the auspices of FIDE and Asian Chess Federation from 13th November to 15th November 2021 took place the Arbiters' Workshop online, organized by Uzbekistan Chess Federation and Zone 3.4 FIDE President for the further training of arbiters.

The Workshop was carried out by FIDE Lecturer IA Ashot Vardapetyan (Armenia), the assistant was FIDE Lecturer IA Husan Turdialiev (Uzbekistan).

The objective was to train a cadre of FAs and IAs from Asia, who are on top of all the recent changes in the Laws of Chess and the FIDE Competition Rules.

Totally 12 participants from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Russia, Ukraine and Uzbekistan took part in the Workshop. Some participants were even present both online and at the Workshop Hall for the better experience.

106th Internet-based FIDE Arbiters Seminar



The 106th Internet Based FIDE Arbiters' Seminar was held 3rd to 5th December 2021. It was organized by the Asian Chess Federation in cooperation with the South Asian Chess Council under the auspices of FIDE.

The Lecturer was IA Casto Abundo (PHI), FIDE Lecturer and the Assistant Lecturer was IA Haroon or Rashid (BAN). Technical Assistant was IA K.K. Chan of Hong Kong. The language of the Seminar was English.

Twenty four (24) participants from thirteen (13) federations (AUS, BAN, BHU, ESP, IND, KAZ, LAO, MAS, PAK, PHI, RSA, SRI, TRK) participated in the Seminar and 22 of them participated in the examination test, held after the end of the lectures.



CONTINENT:

PERIOD:

KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS (KPIs)¹ are the critical (key) indicators of progress toward an intended result.

The Continent is required to measure the effectiveness of its programmes using the KPIs listed below. At the beginning of the period, the Continent is expected to complete both the **Baseline** and **End of Period-target** values. It is possible that the Continent may not be able to report on a particular KPI and this will be taken into consideration at the end of the reporting period. Continents can also make use of the '**Comments**' field as required. The Continent is also allowed to include any additional KPIs that it considers to be relevant for reporting purposes.

When the Continent is preparing its final report for the end of the reporting period, the **Actual** values of the KPIs need to be completed for each KPI identified. Continents are also mandated to work with **all zones** in the preparation of plans to ensure there is development across the entire continent.

KPI STRUCTURE

The KPIs' shall be divided into 4 main categories as follows:

Core: These KPIs are related to the technical operations of the Continental body. It includes number of active players, number of tournaments, average player ratings as well as supporting 'infrastructure' e.g. number of arbiters, trainers ETC. Most of this information can be sourced from the Elista office. This KPI allows FIDE to ascertain the quality/quantity of the players, technical officials events, etc...

Social/Special: These examine the engagement in additional programmes related to the work of other FIDE Commissions and their priorities. These include females, kids/chess in education, vulnerable groups (refugees, people with special needs, chess in prisons etc.). Continents are encouraged to engage in at least one such programme. This KPI allows Continental bodies to fulfil the horizontal goals of FIDE through commission collaboration.

Promotion: This refers to the focus on the dissemination and profiling of chess activities of the Continent and FIDE support. This should include mainstream and social media. It is important that chess activities are highlighted so persons within the wider communities understand the value of chess and the role of FIDE which can increase the opportunities for support.

Partnerships: This includes sponsors, strategic partners whose objectives are aligned to the Continent. Strategic partners can include other government agencies, NGOS, media outlets.

Of course, Continents can also include any other KPIs they see as relevant to their operations.

The KPIs are listed in the table below.
