

264 players from 35 European federations registered for the event. About 40 venues and 82 arbiters took part in this larger operation that was a necessity due to travel bans. 36 top players qualified for the FIDE World Cup 2021 in Sochi.

### 3. Developing/guiding new Erasmus+ projects



The European Union has increased its participation in the fund Erasmus+. ECU Education, and its' members, has been part of several successful applications and projects. In two seminars Jesper Bergmark Hall and Alessandro Dominici shares their experiences with European National Chess Federations with the goal to support more applications for chess to the Erasmus+ fund.

From 14th to 18th November 2021, a FIDE Arbiters' Seminar was organized in Terme Catez, Slovenia, by the European Chess Union, under the auspices of FIDE. The Lecturer was IA Prokopova, Jirina (CZE), FIDE Lecturer and the Assistant Lecturer was IA Karali, Tania (GRE). The language of the Seminar was English.

Sixteen (16) participants from nine (9) Federations (BLR, ENG, FIN, GRE, IRQ, ITA, POL, RUS, and SLO) participated in the Seminar and twelve (12) of them participated in the examination test, held after the end of the lectures.


### 6. Tournament of Peace Croatia

The historical chess event, Tournament of Peace 2021, took place from 5th-10th October 2021, in Zagreb, Croatia. The tournament is played in the National and University Library, with participation of 10 Grandmasters playing a round-robin event in 9 rounds. The participants are: Ernesto Inarkiev (RUS, 2668), Etienne Bacrot (FRA, 2658), Igor Kovalenko (LAT, 2647), Sergei Movsesian (ARM, 2627), Ante Brkic (CRO, 2621), Zdenko Kozul (CRO, 2601), Marin Bosiocic (CRO, 2573), Hrvoje Stevic (CRO, 2570), Robert Zelcic (CRO, 2522), Mladen Palac (CRO, 2517). The historical tournament supported by 5000 euros.

### 8. Mitropa Hybrid Cup 2021

The Mitropa Cup is the annual team chess tournament for national teams from Central Europe. The traditional team event this year brings together 10 nations competing against each other in an Open and a Women section on 4 boards each. Austria, Croatia, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland. The event commenced in 1976 in Innsbruck. The event was held successfully in Hybrid format and FIDE Rated: The event has a 90,000 euros budget and supported with 5000 euros.

### 9. Annual European Online Training Academy



The second ECU Annual training program by European chess Union, supported by the FIDE Development Fund and technical executed by European chess academy Maribor has started on 6th of November 2021 and will last until the end of April 2022. Players are divided in to the 4 levels according to strength. Each level will have 24 lectures.

This year are registered 236 participants from 41 countries including 150 participants with free entry (FIDE DEV Support) winners of European Championships and nominations by the National Chess Federations.

World Medalists winners Elena Krasenkowa (RUS( & Birnboim Natham (ISR) supported with accommodation and fee expenses to play the European Senior Chess Championship in Italy.

#### 11. European Girls and Women's weekend



The European Girls and Women's weekend took place Online, on 14th, 15th and 16th of May. The event was hosted by the German Chess Youth Association, and it gathered more than 800 participants. The event comprised a wide range of events, such as tournaments, simultaneous exhibitions with live commentaries, workshops, and coaching sessions.
