KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS (KPIs)¹ are the critical (key) indicators of progress toward an intended result.

The NCF is required to measure the effectiveness of its programmes using the KPIs listed below. At the beginning of the period, the NCF is expected to complete both the **Baseline** and **End of Period-target** values. It is possible that a Federation may not be able to report on a particular KPI and this will be taken into consideration at the end of the reporting period. NCFs can also make use of the '**Comments**' field as required. The NCF is also allowed to include any additional KPIs that it considers to be relevant for reporting purposes. When the NCF is preparing its final report for the end of the reporting period, the **Actual** values of the KPIs need to be completed for each KPI identified.

KPI STRUCTURE

The KPIs' shall be divided into 4 main categories as follows:

Core: These KPIs are related to the technical operations of the federation. It includes number of active players, number of tournaments, average player ratings as well as supporting 'infrastructure' e.g. number of arbiters, trainers ETC. Most of this information can be sourced from by FIDE via its website or from the Elista office. This KPI allows FIDE to ascertain the quality/quantity of the players, technical officials events, etc...

Social/Special: These examine the engagement in additional programmes related to the work of other FIDE Commissions and their priorities. These include: females, kids/chess in education, vulnerable groups (refugees, people with special needs, chess in prisons etc.). Federations are encouraged to engage in at least one such programme. This KPI allows federations to fulfil the horizontal goals of FIDE as chess impacts several aspects of society.

Promotion: This includes the focus on the dissemination and profiling of chess activities of the federation and FIDE support. This should include mainstream and social media. It is important that chess activities are highlighted so persons within the wider communities understand the value of chess and the role of FIDE which can increase the opportunities for support.

Partnerships: This includes sponsors, strategic partners whose objectives are aligned to the federation. Strategic partners can include other government agencies, NGOS, media outlets. This KPI tracks the efforts of federations to engage other partners in the support of their mandate so as to build increased sustainability.

Of course, Federations can also include any other KPIs they see as relevant to their operations. The KPIs are listed in the table below.

The players had their first experiences of playing in a truly competitive environment and with proper time controls. The lower-than-expected rating can be attributed to the players lacking formal coaching or training. We have begun to remedy this issue. We now have a full-time certified trainer on a 6-month contract and we expect to have players cresting the 2000 Elo mark soon.

There is a balance of 575.58 XCD (213USD). We have numerous plans on how to utilize the remaining funds but a final decision has not been made as yet. Options include but are not limited to: increasing the funding allocation for the chess in schools' program, extending and expanding the chess training program, procuring an electronic board to enable the federation to broadcast the top games in future tournaments, and lastly purchasing more chess boards so that they may be distributed to various barbershops and bars on islands.

6. Lessons Learned/Future Improvements:



This was the federation's first year of existence so naturally there are many lessons to be learned and improvements which can be made.

1. Passionate Chess players and enthusiasts can really go a long way in maintaining groups that are established. For example, Sunday online tournaments and on social media chat groups such as on WhatsApp.

2. We have also learned on the flip side of that same coin; it is difficult to grow the game. And it is going to take a lot more effort. However, that effort is quantifiable and gets less when spread amongst a large group. The task is growing that group so that we have an island wide grasp which is a bit more difficult.

3. Efforts to take away the stigma of the game being for a certain type of person has to be slowly broken down. That's why we believe that taking chess to the streets is a first step to alleviate that and to be inclusive of more people. Not just for the players that already know the game or can only play well, but for everyone.

4. Ideas written are usually followed through more often than those that are not. We have followed through on a lot of our ideas after implementing this change.

5. Our accounting has to be more tightly monitored and coordinated with a budget for more effective monitoring and evaluating.

6. Hurdles for small Federations include access to tournaments, training for their players and just the general ease of access to the game as compared to our counterparts in Europe for example.

7. Support has been very limited from our government. Repeated visits and letters are required in order to get a response.

8. We have enthusiasts outside the Federation who have also been pushing the game.

9. We have a few traditional places where chess has been played before the Federation was formed and are still around to date.

10. It is difficult to be an executive member and a player at the same time. Especially if there is aspiration to compete. Most competing players don't want to be involved in the politics of the game. We just want to see the selection criteria and make a plan to be selected. We also believe it is easier to be an executive member when you are older and more advanced in life.

11. More media exposure is definitely needed. Talk shows, boosts of events on social mediaFacebook and more community outreach.


