## A. <u>REPORTS FOR PROJECTS</u>

## 1. EUROPEAN



The 1st European Pairs Chess Championship, an official side event of the European Olympic Games Krakow-Malopolska 2023, was organized in Krakow, Poland on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

The event was held in two phases: qualification and playoffs, and the individual medalists were determined by the playoffs in each section (Open and Women's). The combined Pair medals were decided by the final position of the players of each team after the playoffs in each section (sum of points): 1<sup>st</sup> 8-points, 2<sup>nd</sup> 7<sup>-</sup>points, 3<sup>rd</sup> 6-points, 4<sup>th</sup> 5-points, 5<sup>th</sup> 4-points, 6<sup>th</sup> 3 points, 7<sup>th</sup> 2-points, and 8<sup>th</sup> 1-point.

The team of Armenia, represented by GM Shant Sargsyan and IM Elina Danielian, emerged as the Winner of the event scoring 15 points. The Netherlands clinched silver with 14 points with GM Benjamin Bok and IM Eline Roebers in the team, while Azerbaijan came third with 13 points, represented by GM Shakhriyar Mamedyarov and IM Gunay Mammadzada

# 3. TOURNAMENT OF PEACE CROATIA



The 2023 edition of the historical chess event Tournament of Peace was organised in Zagreb, Croatia. It is a 10-player round-robin tournament, took place from 22 to 30 November in the National and University Library.

GM Anton Korobov (UKR, 2667) headlines the participants list this year, followed by GM Hans Niemann (USA, 2659), GM Vasyl Ivanchuk (UKR, 2653), GM Ivan Cheparinov (BUL, 2649), GM Ante Brkic (CRO, 2622), GM Alexander Motylev (ROU, 2619), GM Ivan Sokolov (NED, 2588), GM Hrvoje Stevic (CRO, 2549), GM Zdenko Kozul (CRO, 2531), and GM Robert Zelcic (CRO, 2478).

The Opening ceremony of the event took place today, shortly before the start of the first round. The ceremony was attended by the ECU President Mr. Zurab Azmaiparashvili, ECU Vice President Mr. Alojzije Jankovic, and distinguished representatives of the city of Zagreb, Zagreb Chess Federation and Croatian Chess Federation.

## 7. ECU ANNUAL TRAINING ACADEMY



The European Chess Union and ECU Trainers Commission, with the support of FIDE development fund announce the annual European Chess Union training program from 20 November 2023 to 21 May 2024 with some of the best European and world's chess trainers.

The program will be organized in two groups:

#### • Group A – For players rated 1900+ – Monday 18:00-20:05 CET • Group B – For players rated U1900 – Tuesday 18:00-20:05 CET

The program started on Monday, 20th of November 2023, and each group will have 24 live sessions until May 2024, with a total of 48 hours of instruction. The program is based on the new ECU-ETC Trainers' Syllabuses and aims to systematically develop chess talents.

Each European National Chess Federations was entitled to register free of charge 2 players, U20 Juniors or Girls one on each Group.

In total 150 players taking part in the program.

## 9. DEVELOPING OF THE ECU TRAINING SYLLABUS



# 11. DIGITALISATION OF MATERIALS FOR ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The Aegean University and European Chess Union have an agreement for an online (distance learning) course in chess instruction with the main target teachers at primary schools.

The course is 320 hours, with an estimated working load of 10 hours per week (7months 25% of a full time), or 20 hours per week (3,5 months 50% of a full time that will give the students CTS points. These points are recognized all over Europe.

The course is organized is 5 sections: 1. The history of chess 2. Why is chess good for kids? 3. The Chess Rules 4. Chess as a tool in the classroom 5. Chess materials Beside the material to read the participants will also write 3 essays on topics connected to the sections and make a final test. These are checked by teachers at the university that approve them or not.

Main Task of ECU EDU Commission is to prepare the biggest part of teaching materials in special modules that will be approved by the University structures.

## Update of works:

- A. The memorandum with Aegean University has been finalized in February 2024
- B. The modules expected to be finalized by March 15<sup>th</sup> and the modules will be approved by the University.
- C. The teaching materials are under development.
- D. The University course is expected to start by May 2024.

# 12. ECU EDU Toolbox

The project is under discussion for drafting and finalizing a contract for all materials, rights and final product.

## 13. DEVELOPMENT OF MEDIA-PRESS MANUAL FOR ECU CHAMPIONSHIPS

The manual was tasked to ECU Media Commission and is expected to be completed. by the first half of 2024. The report of completion will follow.
