# CIS Chess in School Project Conclusion 2015-2023



**At the beginning of the 9<sup>th</sup> year of our CIS project, 175 chess students in the primary schools of Schaan, Eschen, Nendeln, Ruggell and Gamprin and now also Schellenberg are attending the chess support program.**

**Other schools such as Schaanwald are in the starting blocks and are just waiting for their students to be able to enjoy “CIS Chess in School”.**

**The LCF (Liechtenstein Chess Federation) would like the Ministry of Education to provide sufficient financial resources so that the CIS school chess project can be continued in the 2024/2025 school year.**

# CIS Chess in School Project Challenges



- Follow-up lessons for students who have to leave the program due to a change of class or school (already being planned).

# Youth Tournaments



The youth tournaments started in March with the Swiss Youth Rapid Championships SJRM in the House of Sports in Ittigen.

The LCF has 8 free starting places, but not enough interested young people, which is why the Arpagaus Brothers were given the opportunity to represent the LCF colors in the categories U12 (Damian) and U10 (Dario & Dominik).

Timea & Anna-Kira (both U20) had a difficult time and ultimately finished 27th (Timea) and 28th (Anna-Kira) out of 28 participants.

Constantin Marxer (U14) came 28th out of over 30 participants.

Damian Arpagaus (U12) unfortunately came last in his category but can start again this year in the same category (U12).

# SJRM 2023



The SJRM was also a great adventure for the two 8-year-old Arpagaus twins Dario and Dominik.

In the U10 category they reached ranks 17 (Dominik, 3 points) and 22 (Dario, 2 points) out of 23 players.

Both are allowed to compete in the U10 category for another two years.



# Höchst (Vbg) & Seebach (ZH)



In Höchst (Vbg., Austria) and in Seebach (ZH, Switzerland) our currently most active SCT juniors (Justine Steck and the Arpagaus Brothers) started the rest of the tournament season.

A lot of valuable experience was gained. Dominik Arpagaus (front) narrowly missed the podium in Seebach.

# Bregenz Open 2023



At the 7th Bregenz Open (Austria) in May, Andrew Heron and Constantin Marxer represented the LIE colors and were convincing.

In the 9-round tournament, Constantin Marxer ranked 11 places better than his starting rank and won 52 rating points.

Andrew played a great tournament. Starting in 98th place, he finished in 52nd place and was pleased with an increase of 117 Elo points.

Verbandspräsident Renato Frick durfte 97 Teilnehmende aus elf Nationen willkommen heissen, was eine neue Rekordbeteiligung ist. Hauptschiedsrichter Dominik Wolfinger wies auf die spieltechnischen Turnierbedingungen hin und gab die erste Runde der Kategorien U10, U14 und U18 frei. Er wurde durch den internationalen Schiedsrichter Michael Hein unterstützt.

### Zwei Silbermedaillen für heimische Spieler

In der Kategorie U10 setzte sich Jakob Lins vom SK Hohenems als alleiniger Sieger mit dem Glanzresultat von 6,5 Punkten aus sieben Partien Jakob Lins durch. Zweiter mit nur einem halben Punkt Abstand wurde Dario Arpagaus vom Schachclub Triesen. Er verwies David Stahr von der SG Schwabing München Nord um einen ganzen Punkt auf den Bronzerang.

Die Gold- und Silbermedaillengewinner der U14 hatten beide sechs Punkte auf ihrem Konto. Die Zweitwertung musste entscheiden. Emanuel Angelovski vom SC Zürich Seebach bezwang in der letzten Runde Theodor Jordan von der ASK Réti Zürich und errang dadurch mit einem halben Buchholzpunkt Vorsprung die Goldmedaille. Die Bronzemedaille erkämpfte sich die beste Spielerin Leeke Giselbrecht vom SK Bregenz mit 5,5 Punkten. Sie verweist das zweitbeste Mädchen, Christina Jordan von der ASK Réti Zürich (ebenfalls 5,5 Punkte),

te), aufgrund ihrer besseren Buchholzwertung aus den Medaillenrängen. Bester Spieler des SC Triesen wurde Damian Arpagaus mit Rang 28.

Die Kategorie U18 verlief spannend, waren doch sechs Spieler innerhalb von 200 Elo-Punkten zu finden. Andrew Heron vom SC Triesen startete mit zwei Siegen, verlor dann aber gegen den späteren Sieger Iwan Dietz vom FC Bayern München (6,5 Punkte) in einer Remisstellung äusserst unglücklich auf Zeit. Mit drei Siegen aus den restlichen vier Spielen belegte

Heron (5 Punkte) Silber vor dem Dritten Edin Haralic vom SK Rankweil.

Der Weltschachbund Fide hat 2022 als Schachjahr der Frauen proklamiert, weshalb es sich Turnierleiter Renato Frick nicht nehmen liess, auch dieses Jahr die besten Mädchen jeder Kategorie mit einem gesonderten Preis auszeichnen zu dürfen. In der Kategorie U10 erzielte sich Eva Nif Schmid vom SC Toggenburg mit fünf Punkten (6. Rang) den Spezialpreis. In der U14 war dies Leeke Giselbrecht (SK Bregenz, 3.

Rang) und in der U18 Malia Siems vom SK Sprengschach Wil (19. Rang).

### Zwei Podeste für Triesen in der Mannschaft

Hart umkämpft waren die Pokale der Mannschaftssieger in jeder Kategorie. In der U10 schaffte dies das Team der SG Schwabing München Nord in der Besetzung David Stahr, Michael Kaprov und Amira Habal (13 Punkte). Nur einen Punkt dahinter erreichte der SC Triesen mit Dario und Dominik Arpagaus sowie Noah Blaser den

zweiten Platz vor der Mannschaft aus Lustenau mit den Spielern Omir Aziz Sükün, Zümra Sükün und Simon Bonnegger (10 Punkte). In der U14 holte sich die Mannschaft SV Bregenz mit Leeke Giselbrecht, Daniel Atlas und Maryam Turdiyeva den Goldpokal (13 Punkte).

Der U18-Mannschaftspokal wurde eine klare Beute von SG Schwabing München Nord mit 14 Punkten, erzielt durch Iwan Dietz, Luis Loefflad und Anton Horlevskiy. Triesen schaffte es mit nur zwei Spielern, Andrew

Heron und Julian Ospelt, auf den dritten Platz.
