Summary of Report Prepared by GM Maurice Ashley, on GM in 10 Activities

With GM Caruana, GM Ashley and WGM Abrahamyan (23 – 28, July 2024)

1. WGM Tatev Abrahamyan's meets with women's team (7/23/24)

As the support system for GM Caruana, WGM Tatev Abrahamyan proved to be a wonderful enhancement to the series of planned events. Though there was initially no intention on our part for her to perform any official duties, she herself kindly volunteered to help in any way we thought useful. As she was arriving a day early from Europe after playing in two tournaments in Spain, the idea was proposed that she work with the top women players. JCF National Executive Council member Ian Wilkinson agreed to arrange matters, and, from the positive words from Mr. Wilkinson and WGM Abrahamyan herself, her appearance was an unmitigated success. The fact that this happened at no additional cost was indeed a blessing.

2. Meet-and-Greet with GMs Caruana and Ashley (7/24/24)

The first official event was a Meet-and-Greet highlighted by GM Caruana and GM Maurice Ashley. Along with GM-in-10 candidates, parents, coaches, press, and members of the Jamaica Chess Federation National Executive Council (JCF), three Ministers of Government were invited to attend. Two of those ministers (Finance Minister the Honorable Dr. Nigel Clarke and Minister of Culture, Gender, Entertainment and Sport the Honorable Olivia Grange) were able to find time in their busy schedules to grace us with their presence, while Minister of Tourism Edmund Bartlett sent a representative.

3. Council Lunch at Tracks and Records with special guests (7/24/24)

The JCF members treated all the foreign guests with grace and aplomb, leaving all involved on a wonderful high from the proceedings. It was a wonderful feel-good moment, and it showed the hospitality and diplomacy that Jamaica is famous for. The meal there was one of the reasons why Tatev, upon leaving, exclaimed: "I haven't had a bad meal yet!" The kind gifts and cordial atmosphere went a long way to the good vibes the guests felt about Jamaican chess and Jamaica as a whole.

4. GM Caruana Workshop and Q and A (7/24/24)

The workshop with GM Caruana provided important insights on the various approaches to reaching a prominent level in chess.

5. Meeting with the Olympiad teams (7/25/24)

Though requested at a late hour, the idea proposed by JCF Executive IM Pitterson for Caruana and Abrahamyan to meet with the Olympiad teams the morning before his simultaneous exhibition was a brilliant one. The opportunity to get advice and motivation from such top players shortly before heading off to Budapest was inspiring.

6. GM Caruana simultaneous exhibition (7/25/24)

It is not every day that one gets to play against the third highest rated chess player of all time! Since six of the GM-in-10 Candidates were not in attendance, several members of the Olympiad team were graced with the chance to play against the legend. In the end, Caruana played against thirty-five opponents, ceding four draws. Afterwards, Caruana had commendable words to say about the players (he cited Rhea Gardner, Emilia-Rose Leaky and Khaleel Bartlett as youngsters to watch).

7. GM Ashley meeting with coaches (7/25/24)

Once Caruana and Abrahamyan had departed, GM Ashley was able to meet with coaches to discuss the future plans of the GM-in-10 program and the workshop that would be held in the subsequent days. The questions and comments were far-reaching, and, in the end, GM Ashley indicated that he was impressed with the dedication, expertise and passion of the educators who hold the keys to the continued growth and development of Jamaica's chess youth.

8. GM Ashley workshop series (7/26-28/24)

Initially, the workshop was intended to be training for the core players. However, since the core players had not yet been established, the workshop pivoted into an opportunity to see, work with, and analyze the candidates in-person in an effort to see who had the skills, talent, work ethic, and behaviour to warrant being chosen as one of the finalists. The methodology chosen had a dual purpose: to show the coaches many potentially innovative techniques for teaching the greater chess community and to throw original challenges at the players that they could not possibly have prepared for. It was an arduous three days with several players revealing that they were not quite yet ready for the kind of rigorous and intense training that it will take to attain the highest levels in chess. In the end, after approximately twenty-one hours of exposure to some of the finest young players on the island, the coaches and GM Ashley were able to have a good idea of those players who they thought were at a good state of readiness. The process was a success, with the next one planned for the beginning of January 2025.

Conclusions

GM Ashley indicated that while it was impossible to be completely objective about matters in which he is directly involved, in his professional opinion, the six days of activities that comprised the first GM-in-10 workshop were an unquestionable success. The response from the children, the players, the coaches, the Ministers of Government and the greater chess community seem to indicate that there was an excitement and a passion to know that the quest to create grandmasters in Jamaica was truly and finally on.

Since the announcement of the GM-in-10 Programme in March of 2023, there has been a noticeable increase in participation by juniors in certain key events. Of particular note is the National Age Group Chess Championships, held in March of 2025, which had over 430 participants, surpassing the record set prior to COVID-19.

However, it takes all of you. It takes all of us working together as one unit to create this success.






