National Sports Council chief lauds CFZ, Project Chess

NATIONAL Sports Council of Zambia (NSCZ) chief executive officer Sombwa Musunsa has commended Chess Federation of Zambia (CFZ) for bringing together the brightest minds from southern Africa to compete in Zone 4.5 Championship in Lusaka.

Players from Botswana, Malawi, Namibia, Zambia and Zimbabwe have gathered for a five-day battle of brains contest. International Master (IM) Chitumbo Mwali leads Team Zambia, which consists of more than 20 players.

In a speech read on his behalf by NSCZ business development manager Brian Sapi during the official opening on Sunday evening Musunsa said the event should be supported as it represents the principle of chess in the region

Musansa said sport plays a crucial fole in the development of individuals and communities in addition to instilling discipline, fostering teamwork and building character.

"Chess, in particular, sharpens the mind, enhances problem-solving skills, and promotes patience and resilience qualities that are essential not just on the chessboard but in life itself. It is also a game that transcends borders and cultures in addition to uniting people from diverse backgrounds through the shared language of strategy and critical thinking," he said.

Musunsa also congratulated

participating players for their continued hard work.

He said their presence is testament to their dedication, hard work and passion for this beautiful game.

"To all the players who have gathered here, I want to extend my deepest admiration. You have trained tirelessly, honed your skills, and now you have the opportunity to showcase your talent on this grand stage.

Remember, every move you make is not just a step towards victory but also a contribution,"

Musunsa said.

He thanked Project Chess Zambia for co-hosting the event with CFZ.

Musunsa also acknowledged other sponsors that include Dadas Chess Academy, of Malawi, Kasparov Chess Academy, Chess Base India, JC Flowers Foundation and The Gift of Chess for making the event a success.

And CFZ president Leslie Chikuse called for more collaboration with Project Chess Zambia beyond Zone 4.5

Championship.

"We are looking forward to a very exciting event while expecting the best from our players," Chikuse said.

Project Chess Zambia chief organiser Andrew Kayonde said the event has for the first time included the under-16 category.

"This addition aims to encourage younger players to participate and develop their skills in chess at a competitive level. The idea is to catch them when they are still young," Kayonde said.

Bwalya withdraws, labels chess arbitrators biased

INTERNATIONAL Master (IM) Gillian Bwalya has withdrawn from the ongoing Zone 4.5 Chess Championship citing disrespect from arbitrators.

Bwalya, who was leading after round three, called it quits yesterday after losing on technicality to veteran Stanley Chumfwa in round four at Urban Hotel Lusaka.

Bwalya labelled arbitrators biased and vowed never to compete in any tournament in Zambia.

"I was having a good game not until the arbitrators changed the rules and spoilt everything. I was winning but they made me lose on technicalities and I feel disrespected," he said.

"There is need for a change of arbitrators and if this is not done, I don't see myself taking part in any event in Zambia."

IM Chumfwa is top with 4.5 points after he was held by his younger brother Kelvin. Chumfwa said in an interview that he is aiming for a top finish.

"I have now taken to coaching but it does not mean I am finished. Remember I am an International Master and I am equally strong," he said.

In second position in the Open section is Bwalya with three points, level with Timothy Kabwe in third position.

In the women's category, Naomi Mwale has kept grip on top with four points, level with second-placed Victoria Mweetwa.

Mwale is confident of maintaining the lead to the end.

"The competition is not that easy but I am confident of keeping the first position," she said.

In the under-16 category, Zambia maintained the lead, with Kennedy Shane and Alunuswe Ng'ambi leading the boys and girls categories respectively.



ZAMBIAN chess players Stanley Chumfwa and Women Fide Master (WFM) Naomi Mwale surrendered top spots after losing their respective sixth-round games in the men's and women's categories of the ongoing Zone 4.5 championship at Urban Hotel in Lusaka.

In the Open section, Chumfwa who is International Master (IM) was beaten by Botswana's IM Oatlhotse Providence who ascended to the top on five points.

Chumfwa, who remained stuck in second position on 4.5 points, was not the only elite Zambian player to record a loss as he was joined by his young brother IM Kelvin, IM Chitumbo Mwali and Chess Federation of Zambia (CFZ) president Leslie Chikuse among others.

Kelvin was silenced by Rafael Sharon with Mwali losing to Namibia's IM Dante Beukes while Chikuse tumbled at the hands of Fide Master (FM) Chola Musonda.

However, Timothy Kabwe defeated Candidate Master (CM) Godwin Phiri to join a group of players that had 4.5 points going into the seventh round. The other players that tied on 4.5 points were Sharon sitting third above Kabwe while Beukes was in the fifth position.

The group enjoyed half-a-point lead over three players in Musonda, Greenwell Chimanya, who had a win against Michael Kaoma and Kelvin and they occupied the sixth, seventh and eighth positions each.

In the ladies' section, Mwale, after four wins and a draw, was beaten for the first time at the event by Christine Makwena of Zimbabwe.

The victory for the Zimbabwean saw her move to the top of the standings with 5.5 points, half-a-point ahead of compatriot Women Candidate Master (WCM) Hazel Mudodo, who had half a point above third-placed Mwale with 4.5 points.

Also on 4.5 points but sitting in fourth was Maria Banda after she edged Mary Mashane while Likando Namakau's win against WCM Zangowanachipwila Nshikokola pushed her points tally to four and fifth on the table.

In the under-16 boys section, CM Kennedy Shane

scored the perfect six after he beat Malawi's Patil Shivasai to open a 1.5-point gap on top of the table.

In the second position was Shane's compatriot Priyanshu Dinodia with 4.5 points after a victory against Joshua Sauti.

Dinodia had a record of four wins, a draw and a loss going into the seventh round where he had a tricky encounter against leader Shane.

The players on 3.5 points were Taonga Zulu, Master Himaksh, Shivasai and Twalumba Lubona.

In the under-16 girls, Alinaswe Namwai beat Nelita Siameja to open a point lead on top of the standings against second-placed Margret Bwalya.

Namwai had six points from six rounds and was followed by Bwalya, who had a win against Elizabeth Chimboza of Zimbabwe while Victoria Mweetwa was third with 4.5 points.

In fourth position on four points was Amyra Jain of Zimbabwe.

Twelve Malawian players are in Zambia for a chess tournament that Project Fide Zambia Academy has organised from 11 to 17 August in Lusaka.

Chess Association of Malawi (Chessam) spokesperson Francis Mwangupili said in an interview yesterday that the association has sponsored Linda Jambo while Dadaz Chess Academy has sent nine.

He said Chessam has sponsored the player as part of grandmaster (GM) project initiative aimed at producing Malawi's first international master while Margaret Ngugama has gone as arbiter (referee).

Mwangupili has commended Dadaz Academy for sending their players to the competition.

He said: International participation is important because it is only through such competitions that local players can get chess titles. It also exposes younger players to international

competition which in turn promotes local talent.

"It is great the Dadaz Chess Academy has sent some of their young players to this tournament."

Dadaz Chess Academy founder Susan Namangale said in an interview on Monday that they have sent eight Under-16 players and she will participate in the women's section. She said: "Four parents has also accompanied the children. They are Shivasai Patil, Faith Chamdimba, Omega Chamdimba, Praise Kakota, Mzati Milanzi, Walusungu Ngosi, Lucie Chimeta, Alipo Namangale.

"This is one way of exposing the children to international events and the only way to improve on the international scene. The parents of the children in collaboration with Dadaz Chess Academy have funded the trip."

Karibu Academy players Miranda Mwafuliwa and Michelle Fossa are also part of the team.

Chumfwa outwitted his elder brother, IM Stanley and Namibia's IM Providence Dante Beukes, who finished in joint second position.

Both Chumfwa and Dante managed 6.5 points apiece.

Kelvin said in an interview that victory did not surprise him as he had trained hard for the competition.

"I'm not surprised to have won as I knew I had put in the effort required to succeed," Kelvin said amid a smile.

He also said he was using the event to prepare for next month's Moja Extravaganza tournament in South Africa.

The tournament is set for September 25 to 29 in Kimberly and has previously been won by Zambians.

"I was testing my skills and strategies in a competitive environment before heading to South Africa. This win is a great confidence booster and I'm feeling ready for the challenges ahead," Kelvin said.

Christine Makwena from Zimbabwe emerged winner with seven points.

In joint second position were Zambia's Naomi Mwale and Women Candidate Master Hazel Mudodo of Zimbabwe on five points apiece.

"As the number one player, you have to perform and I'm happy that I did even if after round four, Mwale looked like a threat when she took the lead. I merely needed to defeat her in round five to win it." Makwena said.
